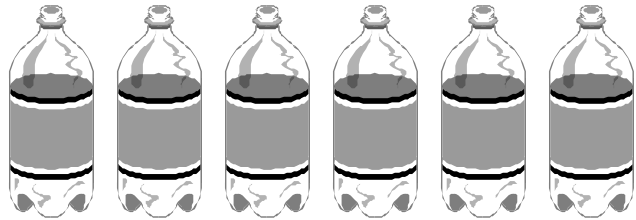
Nona has several program ideas for the upcoming months. But, she is always open to any ideas YOU may have. If you have any ideas you would like to share, get with Nona at our next meeting.
